The Legacy of Colonization

- ▶ *The policy or practice of acquiring full or partial political control over another country, occupying it with settlers, and exploiting it economically* Lexico by Oxford

- ▶ *I want to get rid of the Indian problem.... continue until there is not a single Indian in Canada that has not been absorbed into the body politic, and there is no Indian question, and no Indian department, that is the whole object of this Bill* Duncan Campbell Scott, 1920

Pandemic Stressors

- ▶ Routines were changed
- ▶ Daily responsibilities increased
- ▶ Increased isolation due to physical distancing
- ▶ Job/income losses
- ▶ Death and illness of loved ones
- ▶ Uncertainty
- ▶ Risk of increased domestic violence



Sixties Scoop Class Action Settlement



SIXTIES SCOOP CLASS ACTION SETTLEMENT

The Sixties Scoop Class Action concerns any registered Indian or person eligible to be registered or Inuit person who was adopted or made a permanent ward and was placed in the care of non-Indigenous foster or adoptive parents in Canada between January 1, 1951 and December 31, 1991, which resulted in the loss of cultural identity. Eligible class members could receive compensation between \$25 000 and \$50 000 depending on the overall number of eligible members.

TO START THE PROCESS

Eligible members have until August 30, 2019 to claim compensation.



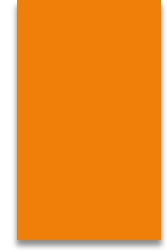

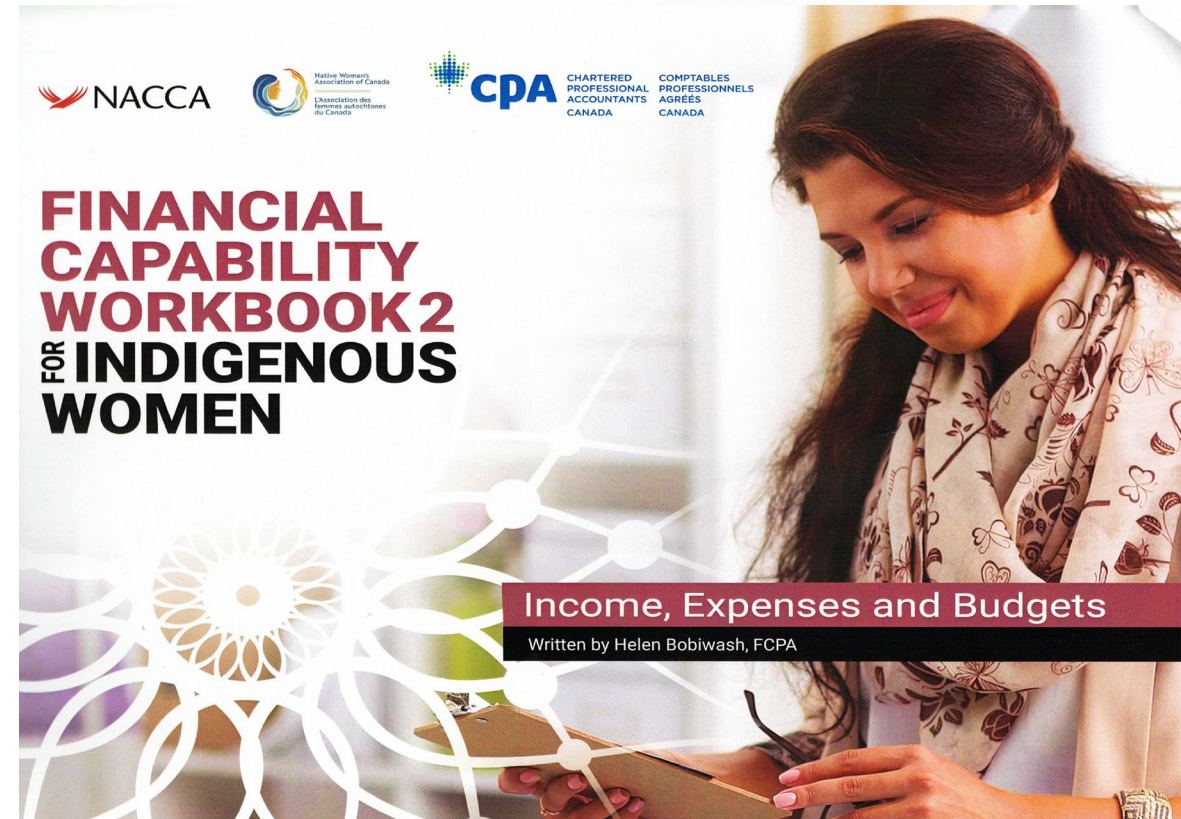

 - ▶ Banking and Credit

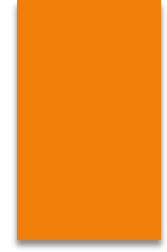


Financial Capability Workshop for Indigenous Women
